Mountain- land (made of rocks and earth) that rises up very high: mountains are higher and steeper than hills

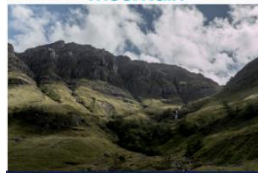
Coast- an area where land meets sea: at the coast, you could find beaches and cliffs
