After sharing the Gospel, Year 6 enjoyed independently taking themselves to a quiet place in the classroom to choose how to respond in a prayerful way. Some children chose to write their own prayer, some drew an image to reflect the Gospel, some read the Gospel story themselves and some chose to sit with friends in the prayer area in our classroom. This was a peaceful and reflective time in Year 6, and it was important for the children to take the time to remember how important this story is to our faith.



Year 3 Forest School

Year 3 had lots of fun creating photo frames in nature as part of their new DT topic on structures. They also explored symbols of the Holy Spirit in nature, such as wind, fire and water. They used carving skills and created bracelets to represent the Holy Spirit.

On Tuesday afternoon, Year 5 and 6 were welcomed back to school with a visit from Amber and some of the team from Cheshire Phoenix Basketball Club. The children took part in three workshop activities where they learnt new basketball skills, how to have a balanced diet and what happens to the human body if we smoke. It was fantastic having the players in school and the children had the opportunity to play games, ask questions and learn from role-models in our local community. We love working with local sports clubs, and appreciate the time the players have given up to visit us before their big game on Sunday!

On Wednesday, Year 5 were visited by Cheshire Fire & Rescue Service. The class learned about how to be safe when a fire happens, and the importance of having a Fire Safety Plan and a night time routine for fire safety. They got to experience what it would be like if their houses filled up with smoke in a fire tent, and how to help themselves and their families escape harm. They looked at lots of different scenarios and how to respond to each one.

Thomas- *'I have learned that we need to test our fire detectors once a week on Test it Tuesday.'*
