They even held the shed skin of the *longest snake in the world* – the mighty python – and braved the smell of the infamous vomit fruit plant! Through hands-on investigation, they identified the palm oil plant and learned how rainforest habitats are being destroyed, inspiring them to think about the impact of deforestation.

## St George's Day

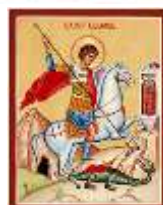
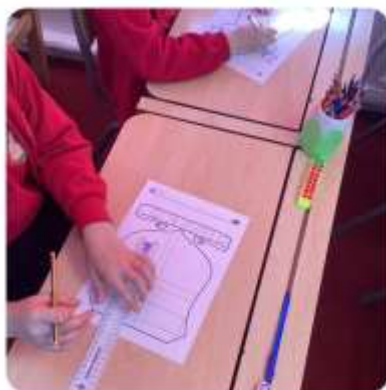
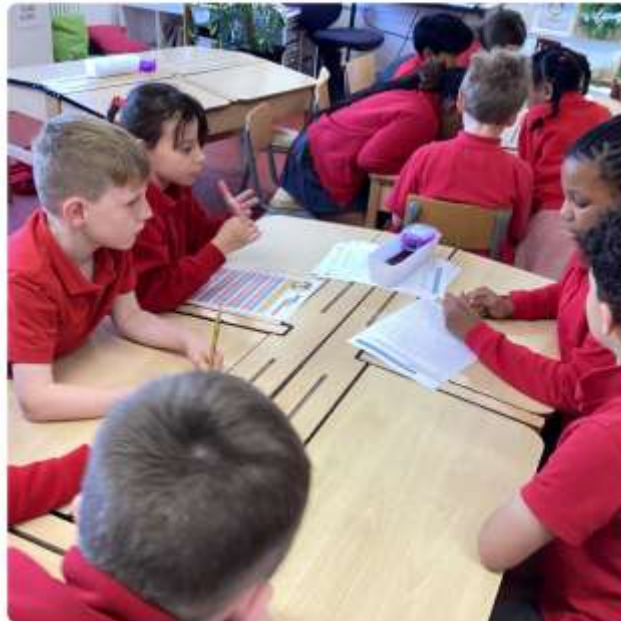
Year 2 Celebrated St Georges Day by sharing all of the children's fantastic homework efforts and the facts they have found out from their task. We then explored the story of St George and designed our own fantastic dragon and explained how it would help our country again.

As part of St George's Day, Year 3 took part in an 'The Mystery of the Knight Who Defeated the Dragon' maths challenge where they used their problem-solving and calculation skills. The children showed great focus, teamwork, and determination when completing the tasks.

In Year 5 we made coats of arms which represent what is important to us. Many children chose to include the St George's flag still as they are proud of the values he represents, but we also had several children celebrate their international heritage as well through their art.

Year 6 celebrated St George's Day by learning about the life of St George and why he is remembered as a symbol of courage, faith and standing up for what is right. They reflected on how his example links to our Catholic life by showing bravery, helping others and trusting in God. Inspired by the legend of St George and the Dragon, the children then created striking dragon's eye artworks using bright colours to showcase their creativity and imagination.
