## Happy 100th Birthday Sir David Attenborough!

To celebrate David Attenborough's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, Year 6 spent their Friday morning completing activities based on the amazing role he has taken in looking after God's world. Children found as many ways to make 100 in maths, completed a reading comprehension on his journey and created fantastic pieces of art work.

Year 6 spotted a link between Sir David Attenborough's role and Laudato Si, so we used this as the basis to our class prayer time.



## Chester Zoo Workshops

Year 1 continued to learn about the affects of palm oil farming on the rainforest during our workshop with Chester Zoo. We learnt what things in our home have palm oil in and how to make better choices towards sustainable palm oil.  
We can't wait for our trip to Chester Zoo to learn more!

The children in Y2 enjoyed the Chester Zoo workshop, and the children applied what they have learnt about sustainability and the devastating impact of unsustainable palm oil has on our rainforest habitats. They remembered that buying products with the Forest Stewardship Council logo means we are making thoughtful sustainable choices.

Year 3 took part in two brilliant Chester Zoo workshops where we explored how much space different plants need in the rainforest using Lego. We found that palm oil plants take up the least space, but they still cause big problems because palm oil is used in so many everyday products. We learned about sustainable palm oil and how it helps protect rainforests and animals like orangutans. We also thought about our own choices in the supermarket by checking whether products use sustainable palm oil to help care for the rainforest.  
We are looking forward to our trip to Chester Zoo!





**Chester Zoo Workshops**

This week Year 5 had their final visit from Chester Zoo. Mike helped the class think about how and why palm oil could be unsustainable vs sustainable.

We played a game where the supermarket products chosen by each child had a direct impact on how much of a rainforest was taken up by unethical palm oil farming. It was a great way to see how, over time, more of the rainforest can be taken up or saved based on what we choose to buy.



Following on from an assembly on kindness which Mrs Baird gave several weeks ago, we have created a Little Disciples box in Year 5.

This is somewhere where people can anonymously put kind, loving and Christ-like behaviours that others have been demonstrating around them.

This has been a fantastic new feature of the classroom so far, and we hope to continue striving for more Luke 6:31 like behaviour!

They learnt all about the habitat that has been created and what wildlife we will hopefully see in the coming months. They learnt about the different types of plants, what pond life they attract and how they contribute to the environment.

This is a very exciting learning space that will provide lots of learning opportunities in the years to come!

A big thank you to Cheshire Wildlife Trust for allowing us to be part of this fully funded project.

We had a lovely babies and toddler session this week. Our next session is on the 9th July, this will be our last session before the summer break.



This week in Geography club we became weather reporters and talked about all the different weather conditions the UK experience. We then used this knowledge to make our own weather reporter.

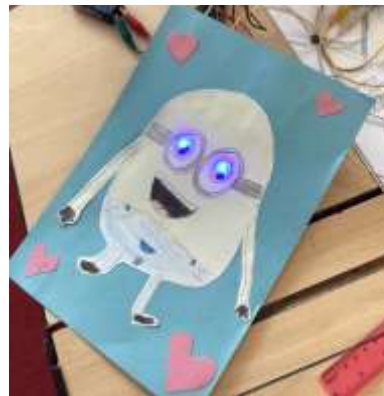


Please pray for Marcus in Y4 who has been in Alder Hey hospital this week undergoing tests.
