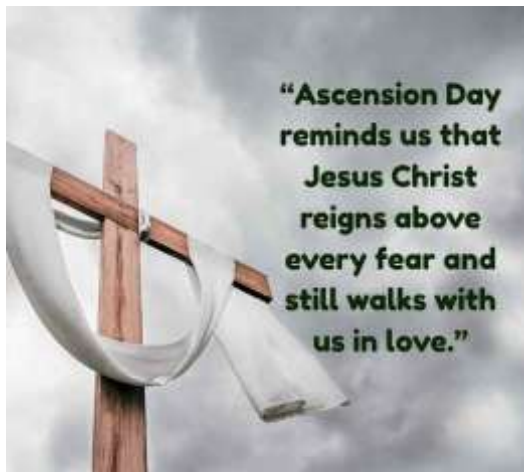

As you know, St Saviour's School is turning 60 this year.

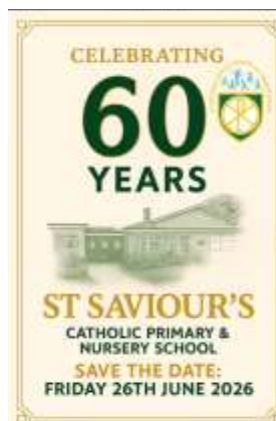
The junior school was opened in April and the infants school 8 months later. Our celebration will be taking place on Friday 26th June.
