Oracy Project with EPCHS

On Monday, Year 5 took part in the Golden Key Speaking Workshop. The children worked in small groups with pupils from Ellesmere Port Catholic High School to develop their debating skills. We learnt the rules: listen respectfully, encourage each other and that everyone has a voice. The EPCHS pupils discussed tips for speaking to an audience, played games with the Year 5 pupils and coached them through mini debates. The groups then had time to plan their debate and some children then had the opportunity to share them. Most importantly, we learnt to listen to each other's points of view and how to respond if we disagreed or had a question. All children were given certificates which were designed by the EPCHS pupils.

Y6 Magistrates Workshop
