
Urenco Workshop: Y4

The children in Y4 enjoyed their Science workshop this week, led by Unrenco. We learnt about what Urenco do and how they sort uranium 238 and uranium 235 to generate fuel for power plants. We sorted substances and learnt the best methods for this. We investigated whether different substances were acids or alkalis. We explored chromatography to see how a black pen is made up of lots of different coloured inks. We also learnt how centrifuges can separate mixtures and when we might need to use these.
